

The Guidance Staff has been working with current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders to fill out course registration cards for the 2005-06 school year. By the end of March, each student will have participated in a presentation on course selection through either Integrated Science, World History or American History. Counselors sit with each

student individually to review their selections prior to turning in the registration cards. By April 8, all cards for current students should be turned in to guidance. During the month of April, juniors will attend a presentation by Pasco Hernando Community College and St. Petersburg College. Juniors who meet the require-

ments to attend a state university will also attend a presentation by the University of South Florida. Juniors planning on attending a four year university should plan to take the ACT and SAT tests this school year.
