## 2008-09 IB/AP Results *Written by Dr. Debbie Lepley, Assistant Principal*

Indeed, our International Baccalaureate Students (11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup>), our Program to Identify Baccalaureate Students (09<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup>) and our Advanced Placement Students have demonstrated that Gulf High School is **Anchored In Excellence, United in Pride!** Both IB/AP results for 2009 broke some academic records for the GHS community as well as the worldwide community. Congratulations to our students, their parents, and the excellent IB/AP academic teaching team.

Our **IB** data demonstrated the following:

1. Seven content areas out of ten scored 71% and above passing rate
2. English, Spanish, French and Math Studies scored a 95% and above passing rate
3. GHS students scored higher than the Worldwide Average in the following content areas:

Our **Advanced Placement** results demonstrated the following:

1. AP English Comp increased the pass rate from 2008 by 20.7% with 59.7% of the students passing. AP English Lit had 53.5% of the students passing.
2. AP World History jumped from 2008 rate of 15% to 57% students passing the exam. AP Gov/Pol also jumped from 29% in 2008 to 57% for the 2009 school year.
3. AP European History had a 2008 passing rate of 31%. The rate for 2009 doubled with 61.5%.

Again, the Administrative team at GHS is extremely proud of our students and their teachers for their exemplary academic achievements in these national and international assessments!
