PIB (PROGRAMME FOR IDENTIFYING BACCALAUREATE STUDENTS)

The International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IB) offers highachieving, highperforming students an opportunity to pursue a rigorous program of studies during their high school years. The IB Diploma is widely accepted at universities and colleges throughout the world. Gulf High School is the West Pasco school site to offer this wonderful program.

Indeed, I find this initial entry into the GHS Gazette to be an exciting and fulfilling moment for our PIB students,

teachers, parents and the administration. This update has several entities to pull from with brevity being a necessity.

Mrs. Rosie Browning, International Baccalaureate North America Consultant, spent September 14th with the GHS administration and PIB lead writers (Mrs. Alwood, Mrs. Currelly, Ms. Peek, Mrs. Rodriguez, Dr. Wildey) to review our progress toward becoming an IBO authorized school site. Mrs. Browning's Evaluative Progress Report found the following:

"Everything that I observed tells me that this school is moving along very smoothly. Everyone who is involved is on target. Many policies and procedures have been implemented; teachers have been trained: students are ready. This will be a school to set as a model that schools should emulate."

Mrs. Browning will be returning to GHS in January 2006 for a second evaluation. Our actual application will be submitted in May 2006. The August Parent Survev results (30% response rate) were extremely positive. We do value parent and student input as we continue to develop and improve our program. For example, we had a terrific response on the summer picnic and the workshops. This will become

an annual event as new PIB families are brought into the fold.

A letter was sent out September 27th to each PIB student to give the parents a forward view of the program requirements beyond the 9th grade year. We enclosed a Power Point document which was presented to PIB students on September 23. Some topics covered are as follows: ROTC and Military Academies perspective on IB Diplomas, Volunteer information for IB versus Florida Academic Scholarship, and most importantly, our desire to support and offer a complete IBO Programme to include the Arts. Such content expansions are currently being reviewed as we will continue to ask for student and/or parent input.
